NEW FISCAL YEAR

The Board adopted the 2017-18 Budget after conducting the annual Budget Hearing at the June Board of Directors Meeting. The new rates are effective with the July 25, 2017 billing statement. The average monthly increase for residential metered lot is \$2.22 or 1.32%. The average monthly increase for Murieta Village is \$1.21 or 0.93%.

REBATES

To assist in conservation, the District is offering several rebates and free conservation handouts; information is available at the District office and our website www.rmcsd.com.

- <u>Toilet Rebate</u>: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water efficient toilet.
- Water Pressure Reducing Valve: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water pressure reducing valve.
- Weather-Based Sprinkler Controller: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a weather-based sprinkler controller.
- Rotator Head Sprinkler: You can receive a rebate of up to \$50 when you purchase and install a rotator head sprinkler system.
- <u>Drip System:</u> You can receive a rebate of up to \$50 when you purchase and install a drip system.
- Irrigation Efficiency Program Including Turf Rebate Programs: You can receive up to \$500 per residential survey for implementing recommended landscape upgrades to your property.

Free Conservation Handouts

- -Shower timer to limit water use
- -Irrigation Drip measuring tool to properly adjust drip flows
- -Rain Gauge to gauge irrigation needs
- -Sprinkler adjusting screwdrivers to properly adjust spray or flow
- -Water saving shower heads saves water by restricting flow
- -Toilet leak detection dye tablets tests toilet flapper for leaks
- -Moisture Meters to determine if soil needs irrigation or not
- -Kneeling pads to work on your irrigation

CALIFORNIA WASTE RECOVERY SYSTEMS

California Waste Recovery Systems (CalWaste) has been providing solid waste collection and disposal services to Rancho Murieta since November of 2005 and has always provided excellent service to our residents.



Services provided by CalWaste include:

- Household battery collection in recycling carts
- Cell phone collection in recycling carts
- Used cooking oil collection at the curb
- Used motor oil collection at the curb

Cal-Waste offers large item collection, up to four (4) times a year per residence with 6 cubic yards (5'x4'x8') per pickup. Large items can include discarded household items such as: furniture, carpets, mattresses, clothing, large green waste, and brown goods. Universal Waste Collection and Electronic Waste collection are also picked up with the large item collection service. Call Cal-Waste at 354-4154 to schedule your pick up.

Another service available is extra green waste collection December 1 through March 30. Yard waste is not limited to the amount in your yard cart — extra plastic bags will be collected curbside. Christmas trees are also collected each year.

Collection days are Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, depending on your street address. The mid-week collection days avoids having containers left out by residents traveling over the weekend. Green waste and recycles are collected on alternate weeks. Garbage is picked up weekly. Hours of collection are no earlier than 7:00 a.m. and no later than 5:00 p.m., unless otherwise noticed.
