RESOLUTION 96 - 14

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE RANCHO MURIETA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT OPPOSING PROPOSITION 218

WHEREAS, a measure known as Proposition 218 will go before California voters on the November 1996 ballot; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 218 would restrict the authority of local public agencies to impose standby charges, which are an appropriate means to ensure the timely and cost effective provision of services and infrastructure to growing California communities; and

WHEREAS, under Proposition 218, property owned by local public agencies and other state and federal agencies, would no longer be exempt from assessments approved by local governments, thereby increasing the cost of providing services to the public; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 218 would impose burdensome and costly procedures on local agencies, further adding to the cost of providing water, flood control, drainage, wastewater treatment, water recycling and other essential services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of The Rancho Murieta Community Services District opposes Proposition 218 as it relates to the ability of local public agencies to provide the necessary infrastructure to serve Californians and support continued economic growth and prosperity.
