LEAF RAKING TIME

With summer ending, the leaves are changing colors and dropping from the trees. Raked leaves can fill the green waste container quickly. If you have more leaves and green waste than your container can handle, place the leaves in a plastic bag, securely fasten the bag, and place it alongside your gray container for regular pickup.

California Waste Recovery Systems (Cal Waste) provides this service annually from December 1st to March 31st, at no additional cost.

NOVEMBER IS F.O.G. – FATS, OILS AND GREASE - MONTH

FOG is not only a weather phenomenon, but in the sewer system it can be a real problem. This **F.O.G.** is **fats**, **oils**, and **grease**. With Thanksgiving around the corner, as a reminder, all cooking grease (frying oils, salad oils, bacon grease, meat drippings, and greasy leftovers) can create plumbing problems, particularly for our sewer collection system and treatment plant, if poured down sink drains. If small amounts of grease accidentally get into a drain, flush immediately with **COLD** water. Hot water and detergent only break up the grease temporarily.

Any cooking oil produced for food preparation and consumption purposes that are no longer useful because of use, extended storage, or spillage can be set out for collection. Just call Cal Waste at 916-354-4154 and they will deliver empty containers for your used cooking oil. Then set out the full containers on your next regular collection day. Used cooking oil shall not contain water, soapsuds, and/or food debris.

Likewise, be careful with putting excess foods in your garbage disposal as they can lead to clogs in the garbage disposal and sewer service.

REBATES

To assist in conservation, the District is offering several rebates and free conservation handouts; information is available at the District office and our website www.rmcsd.com.

- Toilet Rebate: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water efficient toilet.
- Clothes Washer: You can receive a rebate of up to \$125 when you purchase a high-efficiency clothes washer. The overall efficiency rating of the clothes washer will determine the amount of the rebate.
- Water Pressure Reducing Valve: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a water pressure reducing valve.
- Weather-Based Sprinkler Controller: You can receive a rebate of up to \$100 when you purchase and install a weather-based sprinkler controller.
- Rotator Head Sprinkler: You can receive a rebate of up to a \$50 when you purchase and install a rotator head sprinkler system.
- <u>Drip System:</u> You can receive a rebate of up to \$50 when you purchase and install a drip system.
- Irrigation Efficiency Program (Including Turf Rebate Programs): You can receive up to \$500 per residential survey for implementing recommended landscape upgrades to your property.
