Subject: Monthly Improvements Committee Updates

SB 170 PROJECTS –

Water Treatment Facility Sodium Hypochlorite Conversion – The 100% design is expected to be completed in the early spring.

History: HDR has completed the design to the 60% level Design. The 60% design provided an AACE Class 2 construction cost range of \$520,000 - \$660,000 (not including design costs). The District had previously envisioned \$892,500 to complete the project, with \$352,000 allocated from the SB 170 funding. Adding in the \$238,300 design fees would bring the range of estimated total cost of the project to \$758,300 - \$898,300. Staff are expecting draft 100% design sometime in the spring.

Recycled Water Disinfection Project – Dewberry has provided a preliminary report to the district. District staff have been reviewing and provided comments and questions back to Dewberry for answers.

Granlees Safety Improvements – The District Engineer has been awarded the design contract and will be moving forward with project designs.

History: The District has received the preliminary engineering report (PER) for the Granlees safety improvements. The report has been reviewed and the District provided comments to HDR. The preliminary engineering report provided an AACE Class 5 construction cost range of \$300,000 - \$720,000 (not including design costs). The District had previously envisioned \$945,000 to complete the project, with \$170,000 allocated from the SB 170 funding.

The district performed a condition assessment in the forebay structure. This procedure required isolating the structure and utilizing RMCS D equipment to clean out accumulated debris. The condition assessment will be referenced during the design phase for any potentially needed structural repairs.

The forebay report has been reviewed by District staff.

STORM CLEAN UP

Staff has continued with the repair and clean up of the district facilities from the previous storms and flooded areas.

- Tree Tech has been out several times working on removing downed trees around some of the district facilities that caused damage. They removed the trees from the front of the office.
- District staff has also been cleaning up debris around facilities.

- CIA Ditch repair has begun. Schneider Ranch and Jeff Pearson are taking the lead on the repairs.

WATER

Water plant 1 continues to be down for maintenance. Plant 2 is operating at about 0.72 MGD.

Due to a misunderstanding by the vendor. The meter for the airport was not actually ordered. Now that it has been ordered, it is 48 weeks out from now. We tried other suppliers and got the same lead times.

Rio Oso Tank project is still waiting for VFD installation. 1 VFD is onsite and the other one is due mid May.

SEWER

Wastewater Facility

The wastewater facility is off for the season.

Lift Station Projects

Lift Station Rehabilitation – A project kick off meeting was held with the District Engineer on 2/9/23. The engineers are moving forward with the 3B liftstation rehab design. Alameda and Starter Shack are on hold due to pre-fab drop in units will not work, so the engineers are re-evaluating.

DRAINAGE

Lake 11 Project – Below is a picture of the grating that is over the top of the drainage inlet. Our engineers are requesting from the contractors to secure the lid to the structure for safety reasons.



SITE DEVELOPMENT UPDATE –

Riverview: Contractor has completed its punch list items for phase 1a &1b utilities and staff will be bringing infrastructure acceptance to the next Board Meeting for approval.

Retreats: Contractor is working on punch list items. Also, there has been a development with the storm drain. Apparently the elevations were wrong during installation of the manholes and pipes. The inlet pipes are actually lower than the outlet pipes by a couple of inches so there is water staying in the pipes instead of draining out. Our engineer is working with the contractor to get the issue resolved.

Circle K/Shell: The contractor is working on getting their fire service installation approved by the Fire Marshall. The contractor is continuing construction on the Circle K building.

Murieta Gardens Lot 2 (Tractor Supply): Contractor Supply has finished with its punch list items and has opened for business.

Murieta Gardens Pet Hospital (Lot 12): Construction is being done on the building for the pet hospital. The issue with the retaining wall has been reviewed by our engineer and the engineer for the contractor. It has been determined that the contractor will be moving the water line.

BACKGROUND

The Rancho Murieta Fishing Club came to me and requested permission to introduce a new species of fish into Calero Lake. Due to my lack of knowledge, I reached out to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife to see if this was a possibility. I received a return email from Skyler Burson, the District Biologist, and he stated that he loved the idea and was in full support of doing so. The fish are being purchased at a local freshwater fishery by the name of Freshwater Fish Company in Wilton, CA. Due to this approval, I am bringing this to the improvements committee for approval.
