CODERED

The Rancho Murieta Community Services District's (District) Security Department suggests that all individuals and businesses take the time to visit the **CodeRED** website and update and/or add contact information to include cellular phones and other non-traditional phones as well as email and text addresses. *If your contact information is not in the database, you will not receive a call when an urgent message is sent.* In particular, businesses should register, as well as individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, people who have changed their phone number recently, and those who use a cellular phone exclusively or have VoIP phones (such as Vonage) as their primary numbers.

From our website, www.rmcsd.com, follow the CodeRED link in the middle of the page. Those without Internet access may call 916-354-3743. Required information includes a street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes) for location purposes and a primary phone number. Additional phone numbers, email, and text addresses may also be entered.

Examples of times when the **CodeRED** system could be utilized: drinking water contamination, supplemental evacuation notices as directed by County Emergency Services, missing children, fires or floods, law enforcement emergency, chemical spill or gas leak, and other emergency incidents within the District where rapid and accurate notification is essential for life safety.

METRO FIRE CERT TRAINING

The Metro Fire Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness and response. Participants much live or work in the Sac Metro Fire service area. The CERT Basic Class is a FREE 24 hour course that trains participants in basic disaster skills such as: Preparedness, Fire Safety, Light Search and Rescue, and Disaster Medical Operations. Metro Fire offers the course twice yearly: late fall and late winter.

The class is taught over a 2-week period. The next class is scheduled for: Thursday, March 7, 2019 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. (4 hours) Saturday, March 9, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (8 hours) Thursday, March 14, 2019 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. (4 hours) Saturday March 16, 2019 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (8 hours)

FIX A LEAK WEEK ~ March 17 - 23, 2019

Are you ready to chase down leaks? Household leaks can waste more than a trillion gallons of water annually nationwide, so each year we hunt down the drips during Fix a Leak Week. Mark your calendars for EPA's annual Fix a Leak Week, March 17 through 23, 2019; but remember that you can find and fix leaks inside and outside your home to save valuable water and money all year long.

To check for leaks in your home, you first need to determine whether you are wasting water and then identify the source of the leak. Here are some tips for finding leaks:

- Take a look at your water usage during a colder month, such as January or February. If a family of four (4) exceeds 12,000 gallons per month, there are serious leaks.
- Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the meter changes at all, you probably have a leak.
- Identify toilet leaks by placing a drop of food coloring in the toilet tank. If any color shows up in the bowl after 10 minutes, you have a leak. (Be sure to flush immediately after the experiment to avoid staining the tank.)
- Examine faucet gaskets and pipe fittings for any water on the outside of the pipe to check for surface leaks.
- The vast majority of leaks can be eliminated by retrofitting a household with new WaterSense labeled fixtures and other high-efficiency appliances.
